



We use food as a platform to share Christ.






OUR VISION

SUPPORTING ORPHANS IN 2023



The House of Hope, situated in Turkana County, Kenya, remains a sanctuary for children aged 3 to 18. Currently, under the care of 24 dedicated staff members, the facility provides a secure and nurturing environment where 72 children and young people thrive. Rooted in Christian teachings, the House of Hope offers comprehensive support including education, training in essential life skills, healthcare, nutritious meals, and psychological assistance.

Thanks to your prayers, generosity, and ongoing support throughout 2023, we were able to extend our reach and rescue 10 new orphans from dangerous circumstances. These vulnerable children, aged between 3 and 5, had tragically lost one or both parents due to factors such as starvation, disease, famine, or violence. Through your compassion, these young souls have found a new home within the House of Hope family, where they can rebuild their lives with the love, care, and stability they deserve. Your commitment continues to make a profound impact, providing hope in the present and eternity as they learn about the love and salvation of Jesus Christ.



A LITTLE BOY NAMED "ELIMLIM"

Meet Joshua Elimlim, a 5-year-old from Kanamkemer village. Previously residing with his elderly uncle, who struggled to provide adequate care, Joshua's journey took a challenging turn after his mother left him due to hardships from the loss of her husband and financial constraints. In 2023, Joshua became one of the orphans rescued by the House of Hope.

During his time at the House of Hope, it came to light that Joshua was facing a heart condition. After many months of meeting with doctors to determine necessary treatment, he underwent successful heart surgery. Now in the recovery phase within the nurturing environment of the House of Hope, Joshua is regaining strength and can joyfully play with his newfound friends. Your prayers, generous gifts, and steadfast support have been instrumental in making this life-saving intervention possible.







WE ARE GROWING



In 2023, SERV partnered with organizations such as Mercy Medical Life Center, Zarqa Baptist Church Widows Ministry, Al-Haddaf Institute, Squash Dreamers, and Shibi Feed. Together, we achieved a significant milestone by distributing 1,591,664 meals to communities in Jordan and Syria. Amidst the challenges of conflict, particularly in Gaza, SERV played a crucial role in blessing numerous families with the food they needed.

Our collaborative efforts resulted in the delivery of food boxes that included staples like rice, lentils, beans, tea bags, sugar, pasta, and cooking oil. Additionally, individuals received the SERV Food blend, a unique combination of lentils, onions, spices, and bulgur, designed not only to address hunger but also to provide a well-rounded, nutritious solution.




Thanks to your donations and generous support, we were able to distribute 8,771 food boxes and host 31 volunteer events in 2023.

WE ARE GROWING



Our reach within our community has expanded thanks to your generous support and collaboration, and here are some of the things we were able to achieve.

- Hosted our first SERV Block Party in partnership with Goshen Family Resource Center
- Collected 4395 packs of ramen and 1975 packs of mac-ncheese for Ball Ground Elementary food pantry
- Food boxes distributed to the YMCA, The Children's Haven, Hurricane Idalia victims in Valdosta, and various local ministries and organizations to serve individuals and families in need
- Became official partners with Ball Ground Elementary and Cherokee County School District
- Hope For Christmas Food Boxes: 476 families in Canton, 140 families in Jasper
- Donated 10 mattress sets (in partnership with Revolution Church) for the Cherokee Family Violence Center
- Blessed 2 kids with Christmas gifts through Cherokee County School District
- Donated 6 mattress sets through Cherokee County School District counselors
- Donated 6 mattress sets (in partnership with Generations Church) to fulfill Christmas wish lists at Cherokee High School
