

In 2024, we deepened our impact in Turkana and celebrated a significant milestone: expanding our reach to 15 new villages. These once-neglected and forgotten communities are now experiencing the transformative power of SERV Food and the gospel of Christ. With this expansion, we now serve a total of 45 villages across the region, providing not only meals but also the love and hope that only Jesus can offer.

This mission is further amplified through our expanded medical outreach in partnership with Resurrection Medical Missions. By addressing critical health needs in Turkana, we are not only saving lives but also fostering trust and opening doors to share the message of hope found in Jesus.


Your partnership has been instrumental in making these moments of faith, compassion, and transformation possible. Through your unwavering support, we are witnessing lives changed both physically and spiritually. Together, we are building a legacy of hope in Turkana, using food as a powerful tool to bring both sustenance and salvation to those in need.













In 2024, SERV partnered with a network of organizations, including Zarqa Baptist Church, Zarqa Medical Center, Zarqa Life Center, Zarqa Mercy Team, Squash Dreamers, Sudanese Fellowship, Amman Baptist School, and Next Gen Ministries. Together, we distributed 3,000 food boxes to communities in Jordan, Syria, and Lebanon, reaching families profoundly affected by displacement and instability.

The region continues to grapple with a severe refugee crisis, with millions of families fleeing conflict from neighboring countries. Many have lost their homes, livelihoods, and sense of security, settling in refugee camps or overcrowded urban areas with limited access to basic resources. In the face of these challenges, SERV remained unwavering in its mission to provide tangible support and hope.

However, the scale of need often exceeded the resources available. Recognizing the need to pivot, SERV introduced a tea and sugar program as a culturally appropriate way to continue building relationships with families. Sharing tea is deeply embedded in the social fabric of the Middle East, symbolizing hospitality, connection, and trust. By providing these simple yet meaningful staples, SERV not only met an immediate need but also opened doors for deeper conversations and lasting relationships with the communities we serve.

One such program focused on children with special needs, who are rarely included in events designed for their peers. SERV organized fun, engaging activities tailored to these children, creating safe spaces where they could laugh, play, and feel valued. These moments of joy were transformative, offering children and their families a sense of belonging and dignity in environments where such opportunities are scarce.

Despite the enormous challenges, SERV's consistent presence in the region has paved the way for countless life-changing encounters. Families experienced not just physical sustenance but also the transformative power of the Gospel, bringing hope and healing to some of the most vulnerable.

Looking ahead, SERV is excited to expand its impact by bringing teams to the region in 2025. These teams will continue to build on the relationships and trust established over the years, further strengthening the foundation for meaningful, long-lasting change in communities marked by resilience and hope.



SUPPORTING ORPHANS IN 2024

The House of Hope in Turkana County, Kenya continues to shine as a beacon of transformation, providing refuge and renewal to over 80 children and young adults, ages 3 to 18. With the tireless dedication of 24 compassionate staff members, led by our House of Hope Director, Moses Lorukudi, this sanctuary nurtures lives through education, life-skills training, healthcare, nutritious meals, and emotional support — all firmly rooted in Christian values.

This year, we celebrate incredible milestones made possible by your prayers and unwavering generosity. In 2024, we rescued 10 vulnerable orphans, ages 3 to 5, from the devastating grip of starvation, disease, famine, and violence. These precious children, who lost one or both parents, have found safety, love, and a fresh start within the House of Hope family.

We also proudly dedicated a transition house in honor of our founder and his family, creating a space where young adults can step confidently into the next chapter of their lives. Additionally, we marked 16 years of the House of Hope, a legacy of faith-filled service that has transformed countless lives and continues to inspire hope for the future.



LOCAL FOOD BOXES IN 2024

This year, SERV Local has been busy impacting our local community. Through our initiatives, we've witnessed lives transformed, needs met, and relationships strengthened — all starting with a simple box of food.

MATTRESSES

One of the highlights of SERV Local is our mattress ministry, which has provided a life-changing resource for 90 children in Cherokee County. These children, who were once sleeping on the floor, wooden pallets, or piles of clothes, now have the comfort and dignity of brand-new mattresses. Hearing stories from parents and educators about the joy and improved well-being these children now experience has been both humbling and inspiring.



THE SERV CENTER

Our SERV Center has also been a beacon of hope and practical support for our community. Beyond food boxes, it houses resources like brand-new shoes, clothes, and other essential items. This year, it became a vital asset for partners such as our local school district, enabling us to meet the immediate needs of students and families. It's been incredible to see these partnerships grow, driven by the shared goal of meeting the needs of the children of Cherokee County.

None of this would have been possible without the countless volunteers who stepped up to make SERV Local a success. From counting food inventory, to writing an encouraging note on our food boxes, to delivering mattresses, packing food boxes, and facilitating disaster response during Hurricane Helene, their dedication has been the heart of everything we've accomplished.













LOCAL OUTREACH

We kicked off the year with a coat drive that provided 156 coats and jackets to Cherokee High School, ensuring students had warm clothing during the cold months. Partnerships with local churches expanded our reach even further. Events like Revolution Church's Give A Kid A Chance allowed us to serve hundreds, while community block parties organized in partnership with Local Church, Vida City Church, Revolution Church, and Generations Church created opportunities to connect with families in meaningful ways.

One of the most memorable moments of the year was hosting a fun and impactful drive-thru food distribution with the Atlanta Braves Foundation. Together, we blessed 300 families with fresh produce and SERV food boxes, turning an ordinary day into an extraordinary-FUN day for so many!

- 647 SERV food boxes distributed in North Carolina, Georgia, and Florida for hurricane relief
- 128 volunteers wrote scripture and encouraging messages on food boxes, participating in our weekly SERV Center opportunities
- Served a pancake breakfast for Ball Ground Elementary School staff for Christmas
- 23 boxes of food to Oakdale Baptist Church for their Christmas outreach
- 42 boxes of food given to Goshen Valley for their community food pantry
- 42 SERV food boxes to Hopewell Baptist Church for a community event
- 336 SERV food boxes were given to Glory Bound Ministries for their community outreach events.
- 84 SERV food boxes to Shoal Creek Baptist Church for a community event
- 1 pallet of snacks went to Northside Cherokee Hospital for their overnight staff
- 156 coats and jackets donated to Cherokee High School in partnership with local businesses and churches

As we look ahead, we are excited about expanding our efforts even further. With plans to provide additional resources through the SERV Center, we remain committed to meeting the needs of our local community in new and innovative ways. Thank you for being part of our local efforts!

In 2024, SERV International had the privilege to be a light in the darkness for communities facing unimaginable challenges. Through our disaster relief efforts, we were able to provide critical aid and hope to thousands of people — both globally and locally — impacted by devastating natural disasters.





In 2024, Kenya faced catastrophic floods that displaced thousands of families, forcing them into overcrowded displacement camps. The floods disrupted lives on every level — children were unable to attend school, businesses were shuttered, countless families lost loved ones and their livelihoods. In response, SERV distributed 284,000 meals of SERV Food to some of the hardest-hit regions. These meals not only provided vital sustenance but also became a tangible reminder of Christ's love and hope amid the chaos.

Our relief efforts extended to the Mukuru Kwa Njenga slum in Nairobi, which faced compounded devastation earlier in the year. Following the floods, a tragic fire on September 23rd destroyed over 100 homes in the Muindi Mweusi area. The fire, reportedly caused by a gas explosion, spread rapidly — forcing families to flee for their lives in the middle of the night. Alerted by our partner, Pastor Joshua, SERV responded the very next morning.

One of our team members, Ronald, visited the site and met with Pastor Joshua and the local elder, Mr. Kamau. Together, they walked through the charred remains of what had once been a thriving community. It was a heartbreaking scene of ash and destruction, but amidst the ruins, SERV was able to step in, providing meals, support, and a renewed sense of hope to the affected families.









Closer to home, Hurricane Helene tore through multiple states, leaving a path of destruction in its wake. SERV transformed our SERV Center into a disaster response headquarters, mobilizing resources and volunteers to meet the urgent needs of affected communities.

Truckloads of donated supplies poured into the SERV Center as volunteers worked tirelessly to sort, pack, and prepare disaster relief boxes. These boxes, filled with food and essential items, were deployed throughout middle and south Georgia, as well as North Carolina. Heroes emerged in every corner of the response — volunteers not only transported supplies to the hardest-hit areas but also went to extraordinary lengths, including backpacking and even airdropping relief to communities in hard-to-reach areas.

Every disaster we faced in 2024 underscored the power of community and the resilience of the human spirit. Whether it was the flood victims in Kenya, families in Mukuru Kwa Njenga, or hurricane survivors in the United States, SERV's mission remained the same: to be a beacon of hope and to show the love of Christ in tangible ways.

These efforts would not have been possible without the countless volunteers, donors, and partners who stepped up to serve. From packing boxes to delivering meals and supplies, you have been the hands and feet of this mission.















In 2024, over 1,000 compassionate individuals generously volunteered their time and skills across all our programs to support SERV in a multitude of ways. Their selfless contributions played a big role in moving SERV forward. Together, we achieved remarkable feats. As we reflect on the accomplishments of the past year, it is evident that there is still much more to be done in 2025. The journey ahead holds countless opportunities to extend our reach, deepen our impact, and continue making a difference in the lives of those in need.
